Who We Are



Fund Love was founded in 2015 by Diane Owens Zaccagnino. Diane passed away that same year after a nearly 6-year battle with brain cancer. Over the course of her life, Diane had taken a consistent interest in helping those in need, particularly young children and those afflicted with illness.

Before she died, Diane developed the blueprint for Fund Love, with a mission to spread love and help people live longer, healthier lives, including patients and families throughout the cancer community. She charged her husband, Michael, with the task of making the mission a reality. Diane was a businesswoman, 'dream-catcher', artist, community volunteer, cancer warrior, and most of all, a sister to anyone in need.



Why Health

In the midst of COVID-19, the well-being of communities across the country is in severe jeopardy. Without targeted and coordinated investments in **public health, prevention and wellness**, and in programs that address **health and social inequities**, we will experience significant declines in quality of life and in life expectancy.



Black, Hispanic, American Indian, Alaskan Native, Native Hawaiians, and Other Pacific Islanders are **more likely** than their White counterparts to be **uninsured and delay care due to cost.**



60% of Americans have a **chronic disease**. 40% have two or more. Chronic diseases, like diabetes, heart disease, and cancer require extensive **care co-ordination**.



Among peer OECD countries, the US has the **highest rates of preventable hospitalizations and avoidable deaths.**



Black Americans are dying from COVID-19 at three times the rate of white Americans – a result of access and social inequities in the US.

Fund Love supports individual and community health by addressing all determinants of health, with particular emphasis on high impact social factors.






How We're Funded




We are currently funded primarily by our affiliate, Lucania Partners and through generous friends and family donations, totaling \$235,000 in 2019.

Fundraising Priority: Healthy Communities ®



Family Caregiver Program ~ \$75K

The Family Caregiver Program helps family caregivers learn how to successfully navigate the heath system, and effectively manage the health of their loved ones. This program takes on special significance during times of crisis, and its first program on COVID-19 helps ensure that those in the community are equipped with the knowledge they need to work through the resulting health, social, and economic issues.



Brooklyn Health & Wellness Center ~ \$1M

The Brooklyn Health & Wellness Center is designed to improve the care experience and community health outcomes. The Center will provide a full range of programs, connecting the best health workers, doctors, and providers with those living and working in the community, utilizing telehealth technology whenever possible. Our services will emphasize needs-based, culturallyrelevant, patient- and family-centered services, tailored to meet the needs of vulnerable and underserved populations. The Center will be a prototype for building healthy communities nationwide.

I AM MORE THAN CANCER ~ \$350K

The I AM MORE THAN CANCER Campaign was envisioned by Diane Owens Zaccagnino, with the aim of "relegating" all cancers to chronic diseases, by supporting ground-breaking translational research and personalized medicine. The *Campaign*, through FL's partnership with Columbia University, serves as the lead sponsor of the Irving Comprehensive Cancer Center's Velocity ride to end cancer. The Campaign also provides "seed capital" to the Damon Runyon Cancer Research Foundation, to help develop new cancer therapies, and also funds advisory services for organizations interested in improving the patient experience.



Fundraising Priority: Health Collaborations





Brooklyn Communities Collaborative ~ \$500K

Fund Love is working with the *Brooklyn Communities Collaborative* (BCC) to secure its leadership position in the community in the aftermath of devastating State funding cuts and the COVID-19 crisis. BCC has engaged Fund Love to assist with a range of critical activities, including: (1) fund raising; (2) coordination of services for the community; (3) organization development and performance; and (4) financial management. Over the next 12 months, Fund Love will endeavor to raise \$3M to support these activities.

Community Services Consulting ~250K

Fund Love provides community-based organizations (CBOs), including health centers, social services organizations, and religious institutions, with a full range of community services consulting capabilities, designed to help CBOs thrive and develop strong partnerships and collaborations for the purpose of improving the health and well-being of the populations that they service. Specific needs include strategic plans, risk assessments, disaster recovery plans, staff and leadership development, and implementation support aimed at fully realizing desired results.





Fundraising Priority: Health Collaborations





Community Services Organization Development ~ \$175K

As part of its mission Fund Love's Community Services Organization (CSO) supports a range of community-based organizations and collaboratives, helping them plan, integrate, and deliver essential services to meet community need. Current communities of focus include Brooklyn, NY and Newark, NJ. As part of this work the CSO also provides important educational materials both to CBOs and directly to the community in an effort to help individuals navigate the current public health crisis, including to address critical social and economic issues.

Determinants of Health Research ~ \$150K

Fund Love is actively working to better understand the factors that impact health for communities across the country through primary and secondary Determinants of Health Research. By doing so, this will allow Fund Love to assist organizations in determining the most impactful and effective programs for implementation, helping evaluate performance and prioritizing investment funds for development.
